



**OPPORTUNITY:**

The Cariboo Chilcotin Coast Invasive Plant Committee (CCCIPC) is looking for a Regional Invasive Plant Coordinator for the Cariboo Chilcotin Coast area. The CCCIPC is a multi-stakeholder organization dedicated to minimizing the spread and impacts of invasive plants. The CCCIPC is composed of all levels of government, various economic sectors, First Nations, and other interests in the Cariboo, Chilcotin and Central Coast. The CCCIPC was formed in November 2006 and is open, inclusive, and operates by consensus. It was incorporated as a non-profit society in November 2007.

Reporting directly to the committee executive, based in Williams Lake, BC, you will be responsible for a broad range of functions. These functions include but are not limited to:

- Coordinating invasive plant management activities through maintaining the regional strategic invasive plants plan that considers environmental, economic and social values ;
- Collaborate between agencies, stakeholders, and the public that contribute to the collective goals of the association
- Organizing, scheduling and promoting educational projects such as workshops, field days, fact sheets, and informational kiosks while working with various interest groups.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** The key qualifications for this position include:

- A university degree in either the fields of biology, ecology, environmental sciences, horticulture, or natural resource management and at least three years experience in the natural resource co-ordination field, with preferred experience in invasive plants.
- Or at least 5 years experience in the natural resource co-ordination field, with preferred experience in invasive plants.
- Ability to work in a supervised team environment or with some independence
- Ability to establish and maintain constructive working relationships with a wide range of public agencies, First Nations, Industrial stakeholders and the general public
- Demonstrated oral and written communication skills and comfortable speaking in front of large groups of people
- Ability to work well under pressure and with limited supervision.
